	I. Discussed required communications:
	+ Noted that the school will have additional obligations on how it discloses lease payments next year. As an example, a 10 year lease for 100k a year would need to be represented as a 1M liability on budget. As lease progresses, the school would amortize the lease.
	II.Discussed audit report:
	+ Informed the Board that the audit revealed a clean/unmodified opinion.
	+ Also noted that Government Auditing Standards and Uniform Guidance were both clean.
	+ Discussed PSERS liability on the books; noting that the school
	is required to pay about \$1M into the plan, but there was a

\$649,213 income entry which was good news (reflecting reduced expenses because of actuaries).
+ Noted a net position of \$5.7M due to adjustments of GASB
68 and 75; representing a cash increase.
+ Noted there was an increase in per diem rate; additional federal
funds; and less overtime pay.
+ Noted \$688k was spent on furniture/equipment and an
additional \$472k on leasehold improvements.
+ Noted the school had \$10.5M cash; \$4M up over prior year
+ Noted that prior auditors submitted correction plan for last years
issues; that Withum reviewed what prior auditor submitted and did
not take issue with it; and expects federal government will provide
an acceptance letter approving the changes.
